New Business:

SENE Laptop: Cathie has been the keeper of our Lenovo laptop, which let us know it was running out of juice just as we got to this part of the meeting. It has been difficult to use and heavy to carry around. It may be a candidate for the berm in Bob's backyard since it originally ran on the Windows 7 operating system and was updated to Windows 10 right before we bought it used for \$314. W10 this month is scheduled for obsolescence by Microsoft in favor of their latest and greatest, Windows 11 -- which everyone hates. This unit has finally hit the wall and is not upgradeable to W11. Bob, Cathie, and Greg (our iPad/Zoom user) are comparing notes about which way to go forward and we welcome input from anyone else who wants to share info. MS is offering aW10 Extended Support option if the computer itself qualifies. Cathie will investigate.

Website Contract Renewal: There are no changes from last year's contract except Cathie's writing and formatting work on *The Screaming Eagle* magazine, of course, is no longer needed. The mag is now online in digital format only. They promise to post anything we send, but we haven't asked her to do that. Instead, we have been putting everything on the website. For new members who never received it, Bob shared the history and evolution of *The Screaming Eagle* in print.

Cathie submits an annual Activity Log of her website work, which Bob has (all 5 pages and 32 hours of it). She logs the work as she performs it, with software. So we know what she been doing. And this contract has no change in price, despite the increase in hours worked over last year. Motion was made to renew the contract. The Motion was seconded, and passed. Cathie thanked everyone and expressed her pride in the work she does for us.

Old Pictures: Bob brought some old snapshots from 2005, now showing deceased members. They were passed around. John Mastro says he has some also and he will scan and send to Cathie for inclusion on the website. Cathie mentioned that our PHOTOS Archive (2010-2016) pages had crashed during a server upgrade at GoDaddy a few years ago. She offered to restore those pages before anybody went to lots of trouble scanning and sending photos we already have. The photo files are still online in our data file. Bob deferred a decision on that for the time being.

Old Business:

Membership: Guest HP Marshall was recognized as being interested in becoming a member. He served with the 101st and is vouched for by George LeBlanc and Brenda. He is filling out an Application and everyone welcomed him aboard. Conversation followed about the difficulty in attracting new members, even in just having guests at our meetings. Members who visit the Clear Path facility meet great vets they want to invite, but Joiners they aren't. President Bob also shared that we have to fight to keep our older members involved; case in point (coming) 102-year-old Taylor Larimore, who sadly wrote us that he can't participate in Zoom meetings anymore because the computer is too difficult for him to manage alone. Bob is hoping Taylor's son can help him stay in touch. He will keep trying not to lose contact.

Snowbird: Once again in Tampa February 18-21. We had extra 2026 Registration forms for anyone who wanted one. Fact-Sharing of experiences from those who went this year:

You have to get a hotel reservation. It's \$199 a night at the West Shore Marriott at 1001 North West Shore Boulevard, Tampa, Florida. It's only about 15 minutes from MacDill Air Force Base. And they've got nice facilities there, PX, whatever. They've got a gas station, gas is cheaper there. And if you're retired or a disabled veteran, you've got a VA card, you should be able to get on the base and use the facilities. Just if you've got a veteran on your driver's license, they'd rather see that. You'd have to register yourself if you have the VA ID card. They only give you a year on it, so if you don't go back another year, you can't use it. But it's a good time. They put on a good thing. And it's good to get out of the cold weather for a while, you know. It's two and a half miles from the airport. You can see it from the fifth floor, about a mile away.

Blink and Diane always drive down and see Bob and Laura in South Carolina. Whatever they're doing at the table, the registration, bringing stuff out of the stock room, whatever. John brings his lovely wife Fran, and they all sit together. Sometimes they have Freddie Behrens sitting with them. Last year they put the cadets that they bring in that are getting ready in school to carry on with a military career. Some of these kids have more badges than John Wayne. The food's pretty good. Dress code is preferably slacks and a coat with a shirt. No t-shirts, no baseball hats.
